JURY TRIAL (Day 16):

- 8:30 a.m. Jury deliberations began. Court in recess pending deliberations.
- 12:10 p.m. Jury note received.
- 12:35 p.m. Court in session. All parties present. Defendants present, out of custody. The government's case agents, Christopher Fitzpatrick and John Sommercamp, present. Defense investigator, Lisa Gara, present. Outside the presence of the jury, the court and counsel discussed the jury note received at 12:10 p.m.
- 12:40 p.m. Jury present. The jury confirmed they had reached an unanimous verdict. Verdict published. The court determined that an unanimous verdict had been reached. The jury found the defendant, Charles Head, guilty on Counts 1, 2, 3, 5 and 6. The jury found the defendant, Jeremy Head, guilty on Counts 1, 3, and 11.
- 12:45 p.m. Jury thanked and excused. The court took a short recess.

12:50 p.m. Court back in session. All parties present. Arguments heard as to the government's motion for remand. After careful consideration of the parties' arguments and for reasons stated on the record, the court ordered each defendant's continued release. As to Charles Head, a Status Conference was SET for 6/19/2013 at 9:00 a.m. The court granted Mr. Tedmon's request and ordered that Charles Head did not need to be present for the 6/19/2013 status conference in light of his waiver of appearance, but he should be present at any future dates set at that status conference. As to Jeremy Michael Head, Sentencing was SET for 8/21/2013 at 9:00 a.m. Jeremy Michael Head's case was referred to probation for preparation of a presentence investigation report.
